The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

PART I. INTRODUCTION AND TITLE OF ACT

INTRODUCTION

SECTION 1.1. The appropriations made in this act are for maximum amounts necessary to provide the services and accomplish the purposes described in the budget in accordance with the State Budget Act. Savings shall be affected where the total amounts appropriated are not required to perform these services and accomplish these purposes, and the savings shall revert to the appropriate fund at the end of each fiscal year, except as otherwise provided by law.

TITLE OF ACT

SECTION 1.2. This act shall be known as the "Current Operations and Capital Improvements Appropriations Act of 2013."

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34 **MOST TEXT APPLIES ONLY TO THE 2013-2015 FISCAL BIENNIUM**

35 **SECTION 6.2.** Except for statutory changes or other provisions that clearly
36 indicate an intention to have effects beyond the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, the textual
37 provisions of this act apply only to funds appropriated for, and activities occurring during, the
38 2013-2015 fiscal biennium.
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40 **EFFECT OF HEADINGS**

41 **SECTION 6.3.** The headings to the parts and sections of this act are a convenience
42 to the reader and are for reference only. The headings do not expand, limit, or define the text of
43 this act, except for effective dates referring to a Part.
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45 **SEVERABILITY CLAUSE**

46 **SECTION 6.4.** If any section or provision of this act is declared unconstitutional or
47 invalid by the courts, it does not affect the validity of this act as a whole or any part other than
48 the part so declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.
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50 **EFFECTIVE DATE**

1 **SECTION 6.5.** Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective July 1,
2 2014.
