11	(11c) "Law-Enforcement Officer" means a full-time paid employee of an employ		
12	who is actively serving in a position with assigned primary duties an		
13	responsibilities for prevention and detection of crime or the gener		
14	enforcement of the criminal laws of the State of North Carolina or servin		
15	civil processes, and who possesses the power of arrest by virtue of an oa		
16	administered under the authority of the State. "Law-Enforcement Office		
17	also means a probation/parole officer as defined in this section with respe		
18	to any service rendered on or after July 1, 2015.

20	(17a) "Probation/Parole Officer" shall mean a full-time paid employee of t		
21	Division of Adult Correction of the Department of Public Safety who		
22	duties include supervising, evaluating, or otherwise instructing offende		
23	who have been placed on probation, parole, post-release supervision, or ha		
24	been assigned to any other community-based program operated by t		
25	Division of Adult Correction.

27	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2015, and applies to perso		
28	retiring on or after that date.
