- (4) The veteran provides the institution of higher education at which the veteran intends to enroll a letter of intent to establish residence in North Carolina.
- (c) <u>Eligibility of Other Individuals Entitled to Federal Educational Benefits Under 38 U.S.C.</u> Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 33. Any person who is entitled to federal educational benefits under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 is also eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate and applicable mandatory fees for enrollment without satisfying the 12-month residency requirement under G.S. 116-143.1, if the person meets all of the following criteria:

(1) The person qualifies for admission to the institution of higher education as defined in G.S. 116-143.1(a)(3) and enrolls in the institution of higher education within three years of the veteran's discharge or release from the Armed Forces, the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service, or the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

The person is the recipient of federal educational benefits pursuant to 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 (Montgomery G.I. Bill Active Duty Education Assistance Program) or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 33 (Post-9/11 Educational Assistance), as administered by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

(3) The person's abode is North Carolina.

 (4) The person provides the institution of higher education at which the person intends to enroll a letter of intent to establish residence in North Carolina.

(d) Eligibility While Continuously Enrolled at the Same Institution of Higher Education. – After enrollment in an institution of higher education, any veteran entitled to federal educational benefits under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 33 and any other individual entitled to federal educational benefits under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 3

SECTION 2.(a) Funds appropriated to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina pursuant to Section 11.2(b) of S.L. 2014-100 for the 2014-2015 fiscal year for the UNC Yellow Ribbon Reserve shall not revert at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain available until expended and shall be used to implement the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2.(b) In addition to the funds described in subsection (a) of this section, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of four million four hundred thirty-seven thousand four hundred eighty-five dollars (\$4,437,485) for the 2016-2017 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2.(c) Subsection (a) of this section becomes effective June 30, 2015.

SECTION 3.(a) Funds appropriated to the Community Colleges System Office for the 2014-2015 fiscal year for the Community College Yellow Ribbon Reserve pursuant to Section 11.2(b) of S.L. 2014-100 shall not revert at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain available until expended and shall be used to support the cost of charging resident tuition rates to veterans consistent with the federal Veterans Access, Choice, and Accountability Act of 2014.

SECTION 3.(b) In addition to the funds described in subsection (a) of this section, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Community Colleges System Office the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the 2016-2017 fiscal year to implement the provisions of this act.

SECTION 3.(c) Subsection (a) of this section becomes effective June 30, 2015. **SECTION 4.** G.S. 116-143.8 is repealed.

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SECTION 5. Except as provided otherwise, this act becomes effective July 1, 2015, and applies to qualifying veterans and other individuals entitled to federal educational benefits under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30 or 38 U.S.C. Chapter 33 who are enrolled or who enroll in institutions of higher education for any academic quarter, term, or semester that begins on or after that date.
