5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 153A-331 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 153A-331. Contents and requirements of ordinance.
8	
9	(c) A subdivision control ordinance may provide that a developer may provide funds to
10	the county whereby the county may acquire recreational land or areas to serve the development
11	or subdivision, including the purchase of land that may be used to serve more than one
12	subdivision or development within the immediate area.
13	(d) The ordinance may provide that in lieu of required street construction, a developer
14	may provide funds to be used for the development of roads to serve the occupants, residents, or
15	invitees of the subdivision or development. All funds received by the county under this section
16	shall be transferred to the municipality to be used solely for the development of roads,
17	including design, land acquisition, and construction. Any municipality receiving funds from a
18	county under this section is authorized to expend such funds outside its corporate limits for the
19	purposes specified in the agreement between the municipality and the county. However, a
20	county may undertake these activities in conjunction with the Department of Transportation
21	pursuant to an agreement between the county and the Department of Transportation. Any
22	formula adopted to determine the amount of funds the developer is to pay in lieu of required
23	street construction shall be based on the trips generated from the subdivision or development.
24	The ordinance may require a combination of partial payment of funds and partial dedication of
25	constructed streets when the governing body of the county determines that a combination is in
26	the best interest of the citizens of the area to be served.

28	SECTION 2. This act applies to Currituck County only.
29	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
