SENATE BILL DRS35129-SV-9 (03/13)

Short Title: Modify Jacksonville Occupancy Tax. (Local)

Sponsors: Senator Brown (Primary Sponsor).

Referred to:

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO MODIFY THE USE OF OCCUPANCY TAX PROCEEDS FOR THE CITY OF  
3 JACKSONVILLE FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** Section 1.1(d) of S.L. 2009-429 reads as rewritten:

6 "**SECTION 1.1.(d)** Distribution and Use of Tax Revenue. – The City of Jacksonville shall,  
7 on a quarterly basis, remit the net proceeds of the occupancy tax to the Jacksonville Tourism  
8 Development Authority. The Authority shall use at least two-thirds of the funds remitted to it  
9 under this subsection for tourism-related expenditures and shall use the remainder to promote  
10 travel and tourism in Jacksonville and shall use the remainder for tourism-related  
11 expenditures.Jacksonville."

12 **SECTION 2.** Section 1.1(d) of S.L. 2009-429, as amended by subsection (a) of this  
13 section, reads as rewritten:

14 "**SECTION 1.1.(d)** Distribution and Use of Tax Revenue. – The City of Jacksonville shall,  
15 on a quarterly basis, remit the net proceeds of the occupancy tax to the Jacksonville Tourism  
16 Development Authority. The Authority shall use at least two-thirds of the funds remitted to it  
17 under this subsection ~~for tourism-related expenditures and shall use the remainder to promote~~  
18 travel and tourism and shall use the remainder for tourism-related expenditures in  
19 Jacksonville."

20 **SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2017, and expires  
21 on July 1, 2027. Section 2 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2027. The remainder of this  
22 act is effective when it becomes law.
