20			county and/or city airport authorities, housing authorities
21			created and operated under and by virtue of Chapter 157 of the
22			General Statutes, redevelopment commissions created and

24			General Statutes, county and/or city or regional libraries, county
25			and/or city boards of health, district boards of health, any other
26			separate, local governmental entity, jointly owned or operated
