- (b) For the purposes of this section, a person's intention to use a false, hidden, or secret compartment to conceal the contents of the compartment from a law enforcement officer may be inferred from factors including, but not limited to, the discovery of:

 (1) A person fineral controlled substance also believe to extend the content of the content o
 - (1) A person, firearm, controlled substance, alcoholic beverages, or other contraband within the false, hidden, or secret compartment; or
 - Evidence of the previous placement of a person, firearm, controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or other contraband within the false, hidden, or secret compartment.
- (c) It is unlawful for any person to own or operate any vehicle he or she knows to contain a false or secret compartment. It is unlawful for any person to install, create, build, or fabricate a false, hidden, or secret compartment in any vehicle.
- (d) Any vehicle containing a false, hidden, or secret compartment, as well as any items within that compartment, shall be subject to seizure by any law enforcement agency or law enforcement officer within whose jurisdiction that property is found.
- (e) Any property seized under this section shall be subject to the forfeiture procedures contained in G.S. 90-112 regardless of the items or contraband found in the false, hidden, or secret compartment. The remission and mitigation provisions of G.S. 90-112.1 shall not apply to seizures made pursuant to this section.
 - (f) A violation of this section is punishable as a Class I felony."
- **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to be used for grants to local law enforcement agencies to offset the costs of enforcing Section 1 of this act.
 - **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2006.
