2	service on the Committee even if they do not seek reelection or are not reelected to the	
3	General Assembly, but resignation or removal from service in the General Assembly	
4	constitutes resignation or removal from service on the Committee.	
5	A member continues to serve until his successor is appointed. A vacancy shall be	
6	filled within 30 days by the officer who made the original appointment.	
7	"§ 120-281. Purpose and powers of Committee.	
8	(a) The Joint Legislative Lottery Oversight Committee:	
9	(1) Shall study ways to ensure that the purposes for which the North	
10	Carolina Lottery was established are being met and that the net	
11	proceeds from the Lottery will not be used to supplant education	
12	funding but to provide additional funding for education.	
13	(2) Is a permanent oversight committee to monitor the operation of the	
14	Lottery and the budgeting and spending of the Lottery's proceeds, and	
15	to receive and review reports currently required to be sent to the	
16	General Assembly under Chapter 18C of the General Statutes.	
17	(3) Shall study any other Lottery matters that the Committee considers	
18	necessary to fulfill its mandate.	
19	(4) Shall report within 15 days of convening of each regular session of the	
20	General Assembly on its oversight of the State Lottery.	
21	(b) The Committee may make interim reports to the General Assembly on	
22	matters for which it may report to a regular session of the General Assembly. A report	
23	to the General Assembly may contain any legislation needed to implement a	
24	recommendation of the Committee.	
25	" <u>§ 120-282. Organization of Committee.</u>	
26	(a) <u>The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of</u>	
27	Representatives shall each designate a cochair of the Joint Legislative Lottery Oversight	
28	Committee. The Committee shall meet at least once a quarter and may meet at other	
29	times upon the joint call of the cochairs. The Committee may meet at various locations	
30	around the State to promote greater public participation in its deliberations.	
31	(b) A quorum of the Committee is nine members. No action may be taken except	
32	by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present. While in the discharge of its official duties, the Committee has the powers of a joint committee under C.S. 120, 10	
33 34	its official duties, the Committee has the powers of a joint committee under G.S. 120-19

35 36	(c) <u>Members of the Committee shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel</u> allowance as provided in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. The Committee

38	may contract for consultants or hire employees in accordance with G.S. 120-32.02. The	
39	<u>Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative Services Officer, shall assign</u> professional staff to assist the Committee in its work. Upon the direction of the	
40	Legislative Services Commission, the Supervisors of Clerks of the Senate and of the	
40 41	House of Representatives shall assign clerical staff to the Committee. The expenses for	
42	<u>clerical employees shall be borne by the Committee.</u>	
43	"§ 120-283. Additional powers.	

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1	The Joint Legislative Lottery Oversight Committee, while in discharge of official
2	duties, shall have access to any paper or document and may compel the attendance of
3	any State official or employee before the Committee or secure any evidence under
4	G.S. 120-19. In addition, G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4 shall apply to the
5	proceedings of the Committee as if it were a joint committee of the General Assembly."
6	SECTION 2. G.S. 18C-115 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 18C-115. Reports.
8	The Commission shall send quarterly and annual reports on the operations of the
9	Commission to the Governor, State Treasurer, the Joint Legislative Lottery Oversight
10	Committee, and to the General Assembly. The reports shall include complete statements
11	of lottery revenues, prize disbursements, expenses, net revenues, and all other financial
12	transactions involving lottery funds, including the occurrence of any audit."
13	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the General Assembly for the
14	2006-2007 fiscal year, the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) shall be used to
15	support the Joint Legislative Lottery Oversight Committee.

16 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
