2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FREE COLLEGE TUITION TO GRADUATES FROM THE
3	NORTH CAROLINA SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS WHO ARE
4	NORTH CAROLINA RESIDENTS, ENROLL IN A CONSTITUENT
5	UNIVERSITY, AND WHO TEACH SCIENCE OR MATHEMATICS FOR
6	THREE YEARS IN THE STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM OR AT A
7	SCHOOL IN THIS STATE OPERATED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 116-238.1 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 116-238.1. Full tuition grant loan for graduates who attend a State university.
11	(a) There is <u>granted awarded</u> to each State resident who graduates from the North
12	Carolina School of Science and Mathematics and who Mathematics, enrolls as a
13	full-time student in a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina
14	Carolina, and is interested in teaching math or science in the public schools of the State
15	a sum to be determined by the General Assembly as a tuition grant. loan. The tuition
16	grant-loan shall be for four consecutive academic years and shall cover the tuition cost
17	at the constituent institution in which the student is enrolled. The tuition grant loan shall
18	be distributed to the student as provided by this section.
19	(b) The tuition <u>grants loans provided</u> for in this section shall be administered by
20	the State Education Assistance Authority pursuant to rules adopted by the State
21	Education Assistance Authority not inconsistent with this section. The State Education
22	Assistance Authority shall not approve any grant loan until it receives proper
23	certification from the appropriate constituent institution that the student applying for the
24	grant-loan is an eligible student. Upon receipt of the certification, the State Education
25	Assistance Authority shall remit at the times it prescribes the grant loan to the
26	constituent institution on behalf, and to the credit, of the student.

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1	(c) In the event a student on whose behalf a grant-loan has been paid is not
2	enrolled and carrying a minimum academic load as of the tenth classroom day following
3	the beginning of the school term for which the grant loan was paid, the institution shall
4	refund the full amount of the grant-loan to the State Education Assistance Authority.
5	(d) In the event there are not sufficient funds to provide each eligible student
6	with a full- <u>grantloan</u> :
7	(1) The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, with the
8	approval of the Office of State Budget and Management, may transfer
9	available funds to meet the needs of the programs provided by
10	subsections (a) and (b) of this section; and
11	(2) Each eligible student shall receive a pro rata share of funds then
12	available for the remainder of the academic year within the fiscal
13	period covered by the current appropriation.
14	(e) Any remaining funds shall revert to the General Fund.
15	(f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, no tuition grant loan
16	awarded to a student under this section shall exceed the cost of attendance at the
17	constituent institution at which the student is enrolled. If a student, who is eligible for a
18	tuition grant loan under this subsection, also receives a scholarship or other grant loan
19	covering the cost of attendance at the constituent institution for which the tuition grant
20	<u>loan</u> is awarded, then the amount of the tuition grant loan shall be reduced by an
21 22	appropriate amount determined by the State Education Assistance Authority. The State
22 23	Education Assistance Authority shall reduce the amount of the tuition grant-loan so that the sum of all grants loans and scholarship aid covering the cost of attendance received
23 24	the sum of all <u>grants-loans</u> and scholarship aid covering the cost of attendance received by the student, including the tuition <u>grant-loan</u> under this section, shall not exceed the
24 25	cost of attendance for the constituent institution at which the student is enrolled. The
23 26	cost of attendance, as used in this subsection, shall be determined by the State Education
20 27	Assistance Authority for each constituent institution.
28	(g) The State Education Assistance Authority shall forgive the loan if, within
29	seven years after graduation, the recipient teaches science or mathematics for three
30	years at a North Carolina public school or at a school operated by the United States
31	government in North Carolina. The State Education Assistance Authority shall also
32	forgive the loan if, within seven years after graduation, the recipient teaches science or
33	mathematics for three consecutive years, unless the recipient takes an approved leave of
34	absence, at a North Carolina public school in a local school administrative unit that, at
35	the time the recipient accepts employment with the unit, is a low-performing school
36	system identified in accordance with Article 6A of this Chapter or is on warning status
37	as defined by the State Board of Education. The State Education Assistance Authority
38	shall also forgive the loan if it finds that it is impossible for the recipient to teach
39	science or mathematics for three years, within seven years after graduation, at a North
40	Carolina public school or at a school operated by the United States government in North
41	Carolina, because of the death or permanent disability of the recipient."
42	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2006, and applies to
43	students enrolled in the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics for the
44	2007-2008 academic year, and each subsequent academic year.
