assistance of the Sea Grant College Program of The University of North Carolina and the North Carolina Coastal Resources Law, Planning, and Policy Center, shall study the degree of loss and potential loss of the diversity of uses along the coastal shoreline of North Carolina and how these losses impact access to the public trust waters of the State. Specifically, the Committee shall:

Gather information about local land-use management and zoning, (1) current shoreline development trends, and local tax rates, including tax assessment trends for shoreline properties.

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(2) Collect research and information from North Carolina and other states 1 2 iurisdictions regarding incentive-based 3 management tools used to preserve waterfront diversity. Assess the applicability of such tools and techniques to the coastal 4 (3) 5 shorelines of North Carolina. 6 (4) Prepare a draft report with a statement of the issues, a summary of the 7 research, and recommendations to address issues of diversity of 8 waterfront use and access in North Carolina. 9 (5) Hold three public meetings to present the draft report and 10 recommendations to the public and user groups. One public meeting shall be held in each of the three coastal regions described by 11 12 G.S. 143B-289.54(b). 13 **SECTION 4.** Vacancies. – Any vacancy shall be filled by the original 14 appointing authority. 15 **SECTION 5.** Quorum. – A quorum of the Committee shall be a majority of 16 its members. 17 **SECTION 6.** Chair. – The Director of the Sea Grant College Program of The University of North Carolina or the Director's designee shall be the Chair of the 18 19 Committee. 20 **SECTION 7.** Meetings. – The Committee shall meet upon the call of the 21 Chair. 22 **SECTION 8.** Expenses of Members. – Members of the Committee shall 23 receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1, 24 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. 25 **SECTION 9.** Report. – The Committee may submit an interim report of its study to the Joint Legislative Commission on Seafood and Aquaculture, the Marine 26 27 Fisheries Commission, and the Coastal Resources Commission no later than November 28 1, 2006. The Committee shall submit a final report of the results of its study, including 29 any legislative recommendations, to the Joint Legislative Commission on Seafood and 30 Aquaculture, the Marine Fisheries Commission, and the Coastal Resources Commission no later than January 15, 2007. 31 **SECTION 10.** Expiration of Committee. – The Committee shall terminate 32 33 on January 31, 2007, or upon the filing of its final report, whichever occurs first.

SECTION 11. Funds. – There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Sea Grant College Program of The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for the costs of the Waterfront Access Study Committee created by this act.

SECTION 12. This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.

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
