SECT	TON 3. In conducting the study, the Commission may consider the

	Carolina Community College System and the reasons why the
	conflicts or complaints exist.
(2)	The criteria the Board uses to approve massage and bodywork therapy
	programs, specifically those programs within the community college
	system.
(3)	The manner in which the Board executes its duties with respect to
	approving massage and bodywork therapy programs.
(4)	Any other information the Commission deems relevant.
