2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR VIRTUAL LEARNING.
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
5	Department of Public Instruction the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) in
6	recurring funds for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to implement the North Carolina Virtual
7	Public School (NCVPS), which was established as a pilot program in 2005, on a
8	statewide basis. These funds shall be used for purposes including, but not limited to
9	staff and operate NCVPS, develop online courses, employ teachers to teach on-line,
10	provide staff development and expand course offerings.
11	SECTION 2.(a) Chapter 116C of the General Statutes is amended by adding
12	a new section to read:
13	" <u>§ 116C-5. Establishment of NCVirtual.</u>
14	(a) The Education Cabinet shall establish an advisory body called NCVirtual to
15	advise the Education Cabinet on the coordination of resources for virtual and e-learning
16	across prekindergarten through grade 12 in the public schools, public and private
17	colleges and universities, and community colleges. NCVirtual shall assist the Education
18	Cabinet with the facilitation, coordination, and development of e-learning standards and
19	opportunities for all North Carolina citizens.
20	(b) NCVirtual shall consist of 24 members with two appointed by the Governor,
21	two appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, two appointed by the
22	President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one appointed by each member of the
23	Education Cabinet."
24	SECTION 2.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office
25	of the Governor the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) in recurring
26	funds for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for the operating expenses of NCVirtual, which is
27	established under subsection (a) of this section.
