1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL FOR A CARETAKER TO EXPLOIT AN
3	ELDER OR DISABLED ADULT IN ANY SETTING.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-32.3(c) reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 14-32.3. Domestic abuse, neglect, and exploitation of disabled or elder adults.
7	
8	(c) Exploitation. – A person is guilty of exploitation if that person is a caretaker
9	of a disabled or elder adult who is residing in a domestic setting, and knowingly,
10	willfully and with the intent to permanently deprive the owner of property or money: (i)
11	makes a false representation, (ii) abuses a position of trust or fiduciary duty, or (iii)
12	coerces, commands, or threatens, and, as a result of the act, the disabled or elder adult
13	gives or loses possession and control of property or money.
14	If the loss of property or money is of a value of more than one thousand dollars
15	(\$1,000) the caretaker is guilty of a Class H felony. If the loss of property or money is
16	of a value of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, the caretaker is guilty of a Class 1
17	misdemeanor."
18	SECTION 2. G.S. $14-32.3(d)(1)$ reads as rewritten:
19	"(1) Caretaker. – A person who has the responsibility for the care of a
20	disabled or elder adult as a result of family relationship or who has
21	assumed the responsibility for the care of a disabled or elder adult
22	voluntarily or by contract. For purposes of this section, "caretaker"
23	shall include an attorney-in-fact for a disabled or elder adult."
24	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2005, and applies to
25	offenses committed on or after that date.
