6	SECT	<b>TION 1.</b> Commission Created. – The Agricultural Disaster Relief Study
7	Commission is c	created.
8	SECT	<b>TION 2.(a)</b> Membership. – The Commission shall consist of 12
9	members. The	Commissioner of Agriculture, or the Commissioner's designee; the
10	Director of the	Division of Emergency Management of the Department of Crime
11	Control and Pub	lic Safety, or the Director's designee, and, notwithstanding G.S. 128-1,
12	a representative	of the United States Department of Agriculture shall serve as ex officio
13	members. The re-	emaining members shall be appointed no later than October 1, 2007, as
14	follows:	
15	(1)	Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the
16		Speaker of the House of Representatives.
17	(2)	Three members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore
18		of the Senate.
19	(3)	One farmer who has substantial experience as a Christmas tree grower
20		in North Carolina, appointed by the Speaker of the House of
21		Representatives.
22	(4)	One agricultural grower who has substantial experience as a nursery
23		grower in North Carolina, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
24		the Senate.

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1 2 3	(5) One farmer who has substantial experience as an apple grower in North Carolina, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.			
4	<b>SECTION 2.(b)</b> Vacancies. – A vacancy in the Commission or as chair of			
5	the Commission resulting from the resignation of a member or otherwise shall be filled			
6	in the same manner in which the original appointment was made.			
7	SECTION 3. Duties of Commission. – The Agricultural Disaster Relief			
8	Study Commission shall study the desirability and feasibility of providing disaster relief			
9	to North Carolina farmers. In particular, the Commission shall consider:			
10	(1) The general subject of agricultural disaster relief.			
11	(2) Previous disaster relief programs that have been specifically designed			
12	to assist farmers or that benefited a larger group that included farmers.			
13	(3) Whether any other states provide or have provided disaster relief to its			
14	farmers.			
15	(4) Any other issues the Commission considers to be pertinent to its study.			
16	<b>SECTION 4.</b> Report. – The Commission may make an interim report to the			
17	2008 Regular Session of the 2007 General Assembly. Prior to the convening of the			
18	2009 General Assembly, the Commission shall submit a final report of its findings and			
19	recommendations, including legislative and funding recommendations, to the 2009			
20	General Assembly. The Commission shall terminate upon filing its final report.			
21	<b>SECTION 5.</b> Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission shall			
22	receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1,			
23	138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.			
24	<b>SECTION 6.</b> Chair; Meetings. – The President Pro Tempore of the Senate			
25	and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate one member to			
26	serve as cochair of the Commission. The cochairs shall call the initial meeting of the			
27	Commission on or before October 15, 2007. The Commission shall subsequently meet			
28	upon such notice and in such manner as its members determine. A majority of the			
29	members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum. The Commission may meet in			
30	the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the			
31	Legislative Services Commission.			
32	<b>SECTION 7.</b> Staff. – Upon the prior approval of the Legislative Services			
33	Commission, the Legislative Services Officer may assign professional and clerical staff			
34	and other services and supplies, as needed for the Commission to carry out its duties in			
35	an effective manner.			
36	<b>SECTION 8.</b> Cooperation by Government Agencies. – The Commission			
37	may call upon any department, agency, institution, or officer of the State or any political			
38	subdivision thereof for data or other assistance.			
39	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated to the General Assembly, the			
40	Legislative Services Commission shall allocate funds for the expenses of the			
41	Commission established by this act.			
42	<b>SECTION 10.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
