2 AN ACT TO DIRECT THE JOINT EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO
3 CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY ON THE IMPLICATIONS AND
4 IMPACTS OF HIGH SCHOOL BLOCK SCHEDULES ON TEACHER-STUDENT
5 INTERACTION TIME, ON OPTIMUM OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENT
6 LEARNING, AND ON COMPREHENSIVE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 **SECTION 1.** The Joint Education Oversight Committee shall conduct a
9 comprehensive study of the implications and the impacts of high school block schedules
10 on teacher-student interaction time, on optimum opportunities for student learning, and
11 on comprehensive student achievement.

12 **SECTION 2.** The Joint Education Oversight Committee shall report its
13 findings by February of 2008.

14 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
