A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, FOR PEDIATRIC DIABETES EDUCATION AND PREVENTION SERVICES.

Whereas, diabetes is the second most common chronic disease of childhood, and the current obesity epidemic has resulted in an unprecedented rise in Type 2 diabetes among children, a trend that is entirely preventable; and

Whereas, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services reports that as many as 26% of North Carolina children ages 12-19 are overweight, compared to 15% nationally; and

Whereas, North Carolina health care providers have found an increasing number of children presenting at outpatient clinics, emergency departments, and inpatient pediatric units with undiagnosed and poorly managed diabetes; and

Whereas, the economic impact in North Carolina of obesity and Type 2 diabetes related to unhealthy lifestyles is estimated to be more than \$24 billion dollars; and

Whereas, Wake County has developed a successful pediatric diabetes screening, education and prevention program, through a collaborative partnership among WakeMed Health & Hospitals, the triangle YMCAs, the Wake County Public School System, and the Wake County Public Health Department, among others; and

Whereas, this Wake community-based program has screened over 1,200 children and diagnosed over 500 children with pre-diabetes, 73% of whom are now enrolled in an education and exercise program that teaches at-risk children and their families how to adopt healthy lifestyles with the goal of preventing Type 2 diabetes and its complications; and
