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## HOUSE BILL 1583

Short Title: Restore Contract Rights to State/Local. (Public) Sponsors: Representatives Blue, Coates, Goforth, Brown (Primary Sponsors); Faison, Fisher, T. Harrell, Martin, Rapp, and Wray. Referred to: Judiciary II, if favorable, Appropriations. April 19, 2007 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO RESTORE CONTRACT RIGHTS TO STATE AND LOCAL ENTITIES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 95-98 is repealed. SECTION 2. G.S. 135-18.8 reads as rewritten: "§ 135-18.8. Deduction for payments to certain employees' or retirees' associations allowed. Any beneficiary who is a member of a domiciled employees' or retirees' association that has at least 2,000 members, the majority of whom are active or retired employees of the State or public school employees, may authorize, in writing, the periodic deduction from the beneficiary's retirement benefits a designated lump sum to be paid to the employees' or retirees' association. The authorization shall remain in effect until revoked by the beneficiary. A plan of deductions pursuant to this section shall become void if the employees' or retirees' association engages in collective bargaining with the State, any political subdivision of the State, or any local school administrative unit." **SECTION 3.** G.S. 143B-426.40A(g) reads as rewritten: Payroll Deduction for Payments to Certain Employees' Associations Allowed. "(g) - An employee of the State or any of its political subdivisions, institutions, departments, bureaus, agencies or commissions, or any of its local boards of education or community colleges, who is a member of a domiciled employees' association that has at least 2,000 members, 500 of whom are employees of the State, a political subdivision of the State, or public school employees, may authorize, in writing, the periodic deduction each

payroll period from the employee's salary or wages a designated lump sum to be paid to
the employees' association. A political subdivision may also allow periodic deductions
for a domiciled employees' association that does not otherwise meet the minimum
membership requirements set forth in this paragraph.

An employee of any local board of education who is a member of a domiciled employees' association that has at least 40,000 members, the majority of whom are 1 public school teachers, may authorize in writing the periodic deduction each payroll 2 period from the employee's salary or wages a designated lump sum or sums to be paid

3 for dues and voluntary contributions for the employees' association.

4 An authorization under this subsection shall remain in effect until revoked by the

5 employee. A plan of payroll deductions pursuant to this subsection for employees of the

6 State and other association members shall become void if the employees' association

7 engages in collective bargaining with the State, any political subdivision of the State, or

8 any local school administrative unit. This subsection does not apply to county or

9 municipal governments or any local governmental unit, except for local boards of

10 education."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law, except that Section
 2 becomes effective July 1, 2007.
