HOUSE BILL 1729

Short Title: Protect Venus Flytrap Same as Ginseng. (Public) Sponsors: Representatives Justice; and Harrison. Referred to: Ways and Means. April 19, 2007 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE SIMILAR PROTECTIONS FOR THE VENUS FLYTRAP THAT ARE CURRENTLY PROVIDED FOR GINSENG. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 106-202.19(a) reads as rewritten: Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing "(a) greater punishment, it any of the following is unlawful: To uproot, dig, take or otherwise disturb or remove for any purpose (1)from the lands of another, any plant on a protected plant list without a written permit from the owner which is dated and valid for no more than 180 days and which indicates the species or higher taxon of plants for which permission is granted; except that the incidental disturbance of protected plants during agricultural, forestry or development operations is not illegal so long as the plants are not collected for sale or commercial use; use.

16(2)To sell, barter, trade, exchange, export, offer for sale, barter, trade,17exchange or export or give away for any purpose including advertising18or other promotional purpose any plant on a protected plant list, except19as authorized according to the rules and regulations of the20Board;Board.

21 (3) To violate any rule of the Board promulgated under this 22 Article;<u>Article.</u> 23 (4) To dig ginseng on another person's land, except for the purpose of

- 26(5)To buy ginseng outside of a buying season as provided by the Board27without obtaining the required documents from the person selling the
ginseng;ginseng.

To buy ginseng for the purpose of resale or trade without holding a 1 (6) 2 currently valid permit as a ginseng dealer; dealer. 3 (7)To fail to keep records as required under this Article, to refuse to make 4 records available for inspection by the Board or its agent, or to use forms other than those provided for the current year or harvest season 5 6 by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services: Services. 7 To provide false information on any record or form required under this (8) 8 Article: Article. 9 (9) To make false statements or provide false information in connection 10 with any investigation conducted under this Article; Article. 11 To possess any protected plant, or part thereof, which was obtained in (10)12 violation of this Article or any rule adopted hereunder; orunder this 13 Article. 14 (11)To violate a stop sale order issued by the Board or its agent. 15 (12)To dig venus flytrap (Dionaea muscipula) on another person's land, except for the purpose of replanting. 16 17 (13)To buy venus flytrap (Dionaea muscipula) without obtaining the required documents as provided by the Board from the person selling 18 19 the venus flytrap. 20 To buy venus flytrap (Dionaea muscipula) for the purpose of resale or (14)21 trade without holding a currently valid permit as a venus flytrap 22 dealer." 23 SECTION 2. Article 19B of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes is amended 24 by adding a new section to read: 25 "§ 106-202.21A. Venus flytrap dealer permits. 26 No person shall act in the capacity of a dealer of venus flytrap (Dionaea (a) 27 muscipula), or shall engage, or offer to engage in the business of, advertise as, or 28 assume to act as a venus flytrap dealer, unless that person holds a currently valid permit 29 as provided in this Article. 30 Applications for a venus flytrap dealer permit shall be on a form and shall (b) contain information as prescribed by the Board. All permits issued under this section 31 32 shall expire on 30 June of the fiscal year for which they are issued. A venus flytrap dealer permit may be renewed annually upon application to 33 (c) 34 the Board. 35 (d) A venus flytrap dealer shall notify the Board of any change of address or 36 business location within 30 days of such change. 37 The Board shall issue to each applicant who satisfies the requirements of this (e) 38 Article a permit which entitles the applicant to conduct the business described in the 39 application during the harvest season for which the permit is issued, unless the permit is

- 41 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 14-79 reads as rewritten:

42 "§ 14-79. Larceny of ginseng.ginseng; venus flytrap.

If any person shall take and carry away, or shall aid in taking or carrying 1 (a) 2 away, any ginseng growing upon the lands of another person, with intent to steal the 3 same, he shall be punished as a Class H felon. 4 If any person shall take and carry away, or shall aid in taking or carrying (b) 5 away, any venus flytrap (Dionaea muscipula) growing upon the lands of another person, 6 with intent to steal the same, he shall be punished as a Class H felon." 7 SECTION 4. G.S. 14-129 reads as rewritten: 8 "§ 14-129. Taking, etc., of certain wild plants from land of another. 9 No person, firm or corporation shall dig up, pull up or take from the land of another 10 or from any public domain, the whole or any part of any Venus flytrap (Dionaea 11 muscipula), trailing arbutus, Aaron's Rod (Thermopsis caroliniana), Bird-foot Violet 12 (Viola pedata), Bloodroot (Sanguinaria canadensis), Blue Dogbane (Amsonia 13 tabernaemontana), Cardinal-flower (Lobelia cardinalis), Columbine (Aquilegia 14 canadensis), Dutchman's Breeches (Dicentra cucullaria), Maidenhair Fern (Adiantum 15 pedatum), Walking Fern (Camptosorus rhizophyllus), Gentians (Gentiana), Ground Cedar, Running Cedar, Hepatica (Hepatica americana and acutiloba), Jack-in-the-Pulpit 16 17 (Arisaema triphyllum), Lily (Lilium), Lupine (Lupinus), Monkshood (Aconitum 18 uncinatum and reclinatum), May Apple (Podophyllum peltatum), Orchids (all species), 19 Pitcher Plant (Sarracenia), Shooting Star (Dodecatheon meadia), Oconee Bells (Shortia 20 galacifolia), Solomon's Seal (Polygonatum), Trailing Christmas (Greens-Lycopodium), 21 Trillium (Trillium), Virginia Bluebells (Mertensia virginica), and Fringe Tree 22 (Chionanthus virginicus), American holly, white pine, red cedar, hemlock or other 23 coniferous trees, or any flowering dogwood, any mountain laurel, any rhododendron, or 24 any ground pine, or any Christmas greens, or any Judas tree, or any leucothea, or any 25 azalea, without having in his possession a permit to dig up, pull up or take such plants, 26 signed by the owner of such land, or by his duly authorized agent. Any person convicted 27 of violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor only 28 punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than fifty dollars 29 (\$50.00) for each offense. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the Counties 30 of Cabarrus, Carteret, Catawba, Cherokee, Chowan, Cumberland, Currituck, Dare, 31 Duplin, Edgecombe, Franklin, Gaston, Granville, Hertford, McDowell, Pamlico, 32 Pender, Person, Richmond, Rockingham, Rowan and Swain." 33 **SECTION 5.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2007, and applies to

34 offenses committed on or after that date.
