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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENABLE RETIRED HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPALS TO RETURN TO EMPLOYMENT AS PRINCIPALS OF "PRIORITY" HIGH SCHOOLS WITHOUT LOSING RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

Whereas, it is critical to the success of priority high schools that they be supplied with the most highly qualified principals; and

Whereas, retired principals with the highest qualifications should be allowed to return to work without losing their retirement benefits in order to fill that critical need; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

## **SECTION 1.** G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten:

Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service 12 "c. retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed by, or 13 otherwise engaged to perform services for, an employer 14 participating in the Retirement System on a part time, 15 temporary, interim, or on a fee for service basis, whether 16 contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns an 17 amount during the 12 month period immediately following the 18 effective date of retirement or in any calendar year which 19 20 exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation, excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service 21 22 preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousand 23 dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexed, then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the first 24 25 day of the month following the month in which the reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the 26 27 balance of the calendar year, except when the reemployment

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earnings exceed the amount above in the month of December, in which case the retirement allowance shall not be suspended. The retirement allowance of the beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year following suspension. The amount that may be earned before suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the ratio of the Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier, calculated to the nearest tenth of a percent (1/10 of 1%).

The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary under this sub-subdivision, who retired on or before October 1, 2007, and who has been retired at least six months and has not been employed in any capacity with a public school for at least six months immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment, shall not include earnings while the beneficiary is employed to teach in a permanent full-time or part-time capacity that exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the applicable workweek in a public school. The Department of Public Instruction shall certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed to teach by a local school administrative unit under the provisions of this sub-subdivision and as a retired teacher as the term is defined under the provisions of G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a).

The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary under this sub-subdivision, who retired after October 1, 2007, after attaining (i) the age of at least 65 with five years of creditable service; or (ii) the age of at least 60 with 25 years of creditable service; or (iii) 30 years of service; and who has been retired at least six months and has not been employed in any capacity with a public school for at least six months immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment, shall not include earnings while the beneficiary is employed to teach or serve as a high school principal in a 'priority' high school in a permanent full-time or part-time capacity that exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the applicable workweek in a public school. The Department of Public Instruction shall certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed to teach by a local school administrative unit under the provisions of this sub-subdivision and as a retired teacher as the term is defined under the provisions of G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a). The Department of Public Instruction shall certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed to serve as a high school principal in a 'priority' high school by a local school administrative unit under the provisions of this sub-division and that the beneficiary has also met requirements established by

2	the most highly qualified retired high school principals are
3	allowed to return to work as principal of a 'priority' high school.
1	Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not
5	entitled to any benefits otherwise provided under this Chapter
5	as a result of this period of employment."
7	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.

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
