2	AN ACT CREATING THE LEGISLATIVE SPECIAL COMMISSION ON CHARTER				
3	SCHOOLS.				
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> There is hereby created the Legislative Special Commission on				
6	Charter Schools.				
7	<b>SECTION 2.</b> The Commission shall consist of five members of the House of				
8	Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and five				
9	members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. The				
10	Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one representative as cochair,				
11	and the President Pro Tempore shall designate one senator as cochair. Vacancies on the				
12	Commission shall be filled by the same appointing authority as made the initial				
13	appointment.				
14	The appointments shall be made and the Commission shall begin its work				
15	prior to September 1, 2007.				
16	<b>SECTION 3.</b> The Commission shall study issues related to the performance				
17	of charter schools. In the course of the study, the Commission shall consider:				
18	(1) The extent to which the system of charter schools operates, as required				
19	by G.S. 115C-238.29A, to provide opportunities for teachers, parents,				
20	pupils, and community members to establish and maintain schools that				
21	operate independently of existing schools, as a method to accomplish				
22	all of the following:				
23	a. Improve student learning.				
24	b. Increase learning opportunities for all students, with special				
25	emphasis on expanded learning experiences for students who				
26	are identified as at risk of academic failure or academically				
27	gifted.

22	<b>SECTION 4.</b> The Commission, while in the discharge of its official duties,				
23	may exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through				
24 25	G.S. 120-19.4. The Commission may meet at any time upon the joint call of the				
23 26	cochairs. The Commission may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.

SECTION 6. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General
Assembly the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2007-2008 fiscal
year for the expenses of the Legislative Special Commission on Charter Schools.
SECTION 7. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
