1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CHANGE THE SCHOOL STARTING DATE FOR STUDENTS.
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-84.2(d) reads as rewritten:
5	"(d) Opening and Closing Dates. – Local boards of education shall determine the
6	dates of opening and closing the public schools under subdivision (a)(1) of this section.
7	Except for year-round schools, the opening date for students shall not be before-August
8	25, and the second Monday in August; the closing date for students shall not be after
9	June 10. On a showing of good cause, the State Board of Education may waive this
10	requirement to the extent that school calendars are able to provide sufficient days to
11	accommodate anticipated makeup days due to school closings. A local board may revise
12	the scheduled closing date if necessary in order to comply with the minimum
13	requirements for instructional days or instructional time. For purposes of this
14	subsection, the term "good cause" means that schools in any local school administrative
15	unit in a county have been closed eight days per year during any four of the last 10 years
16	because of severe weather conditions, energy shortages, power failures, or other
17	emergency situations.
18	The State Board also may waive this requirement for an educational purpose. The
19	term "educational purpose" means a local school administrative unit establishes a need
20	to adopt a different calendar for (i) a specific school to accommodate a special program
21	offered generally to the student body of that school, (ii) a school that primarily serves a
22	special population of students, or (iii) a defined program within a school. The State
23	Board may grant the waiver for an educational purpose for that specific school or
24	defined program to the extent that the State Board finds that the educational purpose is
25	reasonable, the accommodation is necessary to accomplish the educational purpose, and
26	the request is not an attempt to circumvent the opening and closing dates set forth in this

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subsection. The waiver requests for educational purposes shall not be used to
accommodate system-wide class scheduling preferences.

The required opening and closing dates under this subsection shall not apply to any school that a local board designated as having a modified calendar for the 2003-2004 school year or to any school that was part of a planned program in the 2003-2004 school year for a system of modified calendar schools, so long as the school operates under a modified calendar."

8 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies 9 beginning with the 2007-2008 school year.
