2 The Department of Justice may provide to the Department of Health and Human 3 Services the criminal history from the State and National Repositories of Criminal 4 Histories in accordance with G.S. 130E-159 of applicants for initial or renewal EMS 5 credentialing, and of individuals currently holding a valid EMS credential, when this 6 criminal history information is requested by the Emergency Medical Services 7 Disciplinary Committee as part of an ongoing Department of Health and Human 8 Services investigation as established by G.S. 143-519. The Department of Health and 9 Human Services shall provide to the Department of Justice, along with the request, the 10 fingerprints of the individual to be checked, any additional information required by the 11 Department of Justice, and a form consenting to the check of the criminal record and to the use of fingerprints and other identifying information required by the State or 12 13 National Repositories signed by the individual to be checked. The Department of Health 14 and Human Services shall keep all information obtained pursuant to this section 15 confidential. The Department of Justice shall charge a reasonable fee to offset the costs incurred by it to conduct the checks of the national criminal history records authorized 16 17 by this section." 18

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
