9	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 20-158 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:			
10	"§ 20-158. Vehicle control signs and signals.

15		<u>(1)</u>	The operator brought the motorcycle to a complete stop at the	
16			intersection or stop bar where a steady red light was being emitted in	
17			the direction of the operator.	
18		<u>(2)</u>	The intersection is controlled by a vehicle actuated traffic signal using	
19			an inductive loop to activate the traffic signal.	
20		<u>(3)</u>	No other vehicle that was entitled to have the right-of-way under	
21			applicable law was sitting at, traveling through, or approaching the	
22			intersection.	
23		<u>(4)</u>	No pedestrians were attempting to cross at or near the intersection.	
24		<u>(5)</u>	The motorcycle operator who received the citation waited a minimum	
25			of three minutes at the intersection or stop bar where the steady red	
26			light was being emitted in the direction of the operator before entering	
27			the intersection."	

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2007, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
