2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY HOW PUBLIC BODIES IN HYDE COUNTY MAY		
3	CONDUCT BUSINESS DURING MEETINGS INVOLVING SIMULTANEOUS		
4	COMMUNICATION.		
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 143-318.13 reads as rewritten:		
7	"§ 143-318.13. Electronic meetings; written ballots; acting by reference.		
8	(a) Electronic Meetings. – <u>A public body may conduct official meetings, in</u>		
9	whole or in part, with simultaneous communication. Prior to conducting an official		
10	meeting with simultaneous communication, the public body shall adopt rules of		
11	procedure governing the conduct of such meetings that address at least all of the		
12	following:		
13	(1) The verification of the identity of the member or members of the		
14	public body who are participating by simultaneous communication.		
15	(2) The process of orderly deliberation by the public body.		
16	(3) The process of voting by the public body.		
17	(4) The procedure for recording any votes taken in the minutes of the		
18	public body.		
19	(5) The means by which members of the public can listen or watch the		
20	official meeting and the means by which the public is offered the		
21	opportunity to participate from the remote location to the same extent		
22	as the public at the main location. This requirement shall not apply in		
23	emergency meetings.		
24	(a1) Quorum and Voting by Members of the Public Body During Electronic		
25	Meetings. – A member or members of the public body participating from a remote		
26	location by simultaneous communication shall be counted as present for quorum		
27	purposes, and all votes of members of a public body made during an official meeting		
28	with simultaneous communication shall be counted as if the member were physically

3	<u>(1)</u>	The official meeting was properly noticed under G.S. 143-318.12 and
4		under any other requirement for notice applicable to the public body.
5	<u>(2)</u>	The member or members of the public body participating from a
6		remote location by simultaneous communication are not physically
7		located outside the jurisdiction of the public body. This subdivision
8		shall not apply if the official meeting is an emergency meeting as
9		defined in G.S. 143-318.12(b)(3).
10	<u>(3)</u>	The member or members of the public body participating from a
11		remote location by simultaneous communication can hear what is said
12		by the other members of the public body and by any individual
13		addressing the public body.
14	<u>(4)</u>	The member or members of the public body participating from a
15		remote location by simultaneous communication can be heard by the
16		other members of the public body and any other individuals in
17		attendance at the official meeting.
18	<u>(5)</u>	The vote of the member or members of the public body participating
19		from a remote location by simultaneous communication is not by
20		electronic mail.
21	<u>(6)</u>	If the chair or presiding officer of the public body is participating from
22		a remote location by simultaneous communication, the vice chair or
23		mayor pro tempore or some other member of the public body who is
24		physically present shall preside at the official meeting. The chair or
25		presiding officer of the public body participating from a remote
26		location by simultaneous communication shall retain the same voting
27		rights he or she has when presiding.
28	<u>(7)</u>	The official meeting, or part of an official meeting with a member or
29		members of the public body participating from a remote location by
30		simultaneous communication is not any of the following:
31		<u>a.</u> <u>A closed session, unless the closed session is held during an</u>
32		emergency meeting.
33		b. <u>A quasi-judicial proceeding.</u>
34	<u>(8)</u>	No written ballots may be taken at the official meeting with a member
35		or members of the public body participating from a remote location by
36		simultaneous communication.
37	<u>(9)</u>	If the official meeting involves a member of the public body
38		participating from a remote location by simultaneous communication
39		by which the member cannot be physically seen by the public body,
40		that member must comply with all of the following:
41		<u>a.</u> <u>The member identifies himself or herself when the roll is taken</u>
42		or the meeting is commenced.
43		b. The member identifies himself or herself prior to participating
44		in the deliberations during the official meeting.

1 The member identifies himself or herself prior to voting. 2 The member or members participating from a remote location by (10)3 simultaneous communication shall have been provided with any 4 documents to be considered during the official meeting. 5 Participation of Public During Electronic Meetings. - If a public body holds (a2) 6 an official meeting by use of conference telephone or other electronic means, 7 simultaneous communication, it shall provide a location and means whereby members 8 of the public may listen to the official meeting and the notice of the official meeting 9 required by this Article shall specify that location. A fee of up to twenty-five dollars 10 (\$25.00) may be charged each such listener to defray in part the cost of providing the 11 necessary location and equipment. 12 (b)Written Ballots. – Except as provided in this subsection or by joint resolution 13 of the General Assembly, a public body may not vote by secret or written ballot. If a 14 public body decides to vote by written ballot, each member of the body so voting shall 15 sign his or her ballot; and the minutes of the public body shall show the vote of each 16 member voting. The ballots shall be available for public inspection in the office of the 17 clerk or secretary to the public body immediately following the meeting at which the 18 vote took place and until the minutes of that official meeting are approved, at which 19 time the ballots may be destroyed. 20 Acting by Reference. – The members of a public body shall not deliberate, (c) 21 vote, or otherwise take action upon any matter by reference to a letter, number or other 22 designation, or other secret device or method, with the intention of making it impossible 23 for persons attending a an official meeting of the public body to understand what is 24 being deliberated, voted, or acted upon. However, this subsection does not prohibit a 25 public body from deliberating, voting, or otherwise taking action by reference to an 26 agenda, if copies of the agenda, sufficiently worded to enable the public to understand 27 what is being deliberated, voted, or acted upon, are available for public inspection at the 28 official meeting." 29 SECTION 2. G.S. 143-318.10(d) reads as rewritten: 30 "(d) "Official meeting" means a meeting, assembly, or gathering together at any 31 time or place or the simultaneous communication by conference telephone or other 32 electronic means of a majority of the members of a public body for the purpose of 33 conducting hearings, participating in deliberations, or voting upon or otherwise 34 transacting the public business within the jurisdiction, real or apparent, of the public 35 body. However, a social meeting or other informal assembly or gathering together of the 36 members of a public body does not constitute an official meeting unless called or held 37 to evade the spirit and purposes of this Article." 38 SECTION 3. G.S. 143-318.10 is amended by adding a new subsection to 39 read: 40 "(d1) "Simultaneous communication" means any communication by conference 41 telephone or other electronic means."

SECTION 3.1. This act applies only to Hyde County.

43 **SECTION 3.2.** Nothing in this act shall be construed to affect the validity of 44 actions related to electronic meetings of any other public body. 1 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective October 1, 2008, and any vote taken by a 2 public body that included a member voting by simultaneous communication by 3 conference telephone or other electronic means before that date is ratified.
