2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO PROVIDE TO
3	THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
4	TRANSPORTATION THE CRIMINAL HISTORY OF APPLICANTS AND
5	EMPLOYEES, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE
6	TRANSPORTATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1. Chapter 114 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a
9	new section to read:
10	"§ 114-19.24. Criminal record checks of applicants and of current employees who
11	are involved in the manufacture or production of drivers licenses and
12	identification cards.
13	(a) The Department of Justice may, upon request, provide to the Department of
14	Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, the criminal history of any of the
15	following:
16	(1) An applicant for employment;
17	(2) <u>A current employee;</u>
18	(3) <u>A contractual employee or applicant;</u>
19	(4) <u>An employee of a contractor;</u>
20	if the person (i) is or will be involved in the manufacture or production of drivers
21	licenses and identification cards, or (ii) has or will have the ability to affect the identity
22	information that appears on drivers licenses or identification cards.
23	(b) Along with the request, the Division of Motor Vehicles shall provide the
24	following to the Department of Justice:
25	(1) The fingerprints of the applicant.
26	(2) <u>A form signed by the applicant consenting to:</u>
27	<u>a.</u> <u>The criminal record check.</u>
28	b. <u>The use of fingerprints.</u>

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1	c. Any other identifying information required by the State and
2	National Repositories.
3	d. Any additional information required by the Department of
4	Justice.
5	(c) The applicant's fingerprints shall be forwarded to the State Bureau of
6	Investigation for a search of the State's criminal history record file, and the State Bureau
7	of Investigation shall forward a set of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation
8	for a national criminal history record check.
9	(d) The Division of Motor Vehicles shall keep all information obtained pursuant
10	to this section confidential.
11	(e) The Department of Justice may charge a fee to offset the cost incurred by it to
12	conduct a criminal record check under this section. The fee shall not exceed the actual
13	cost of locating, editing, researching, and retrieving the information."
14	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law
