8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a 10 new section to read:

11 "<u>§ 14-401.14A. Unlawful to burn a cross or hang a noose with the intent to</u> 12 <u>intimidate.</u>

If a person shall burn a cross or hang a noose with the intent to intimidate another
because of race, color, religion, nationality, or country of origin, he shall be guilty of a
<u>Class H felony.</u>"

16 SECTION 2. The Legislative Research Commission shall study the impact 17 of recent cross burnings and noose hangings within the State and determine if any 18 modifications should be made to existing statutes to lawfully deter this type of conduct. 19 Of funds appropriated to the General Assembly for the 2008-2009 fiscal year, there 20 shall be allocated the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to fund this study. The 21 Legislative Research Commission shall report its findings and make recommendations 22 for legislation to the 2009 Session of the General Assembly.

SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2008, and
applies to offenses committed on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective
when it becomes law.
