Short Title: DHHS/Office of Men's Health. (Public) Sponsors: Senators Forrester; Bingham, Brunstetter, Dannelly, Foriest, Goodall, Hoyle, Jones, Purcell, Smith, Stevens, and Tillman. February 21, 2007 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND 3 HUMAN SERVICES THE OFFICE OF MEN'S HEALTH. 4 Whereas, a silent health crisis is affecting the health and well-being of 5 America's men; and 6 Whereas, while this health crisis is of particular concern to men, it is also a 7 concern for women regarding the health of their fathers, husbands, sons, and brothers; 8 and 9 Whereas, men's health is a concern for employers who pay the costs of 10 medical care and lose productive employees; and Whereas, men's health is a concern to federal and state governments, which 11 12 absorb the enormous costs of premature death and disability, including the costs of 13 caring for dependents left behind; and Whereas, appropriate use of tests such as prostate specific antigen (PSA) 14 15 exams, and blood pressure, blood sugar, and cholesterol screens, in conjunction with 16 clinical exams and self-testing, can result in the early detection of many problems and in increased survival rates; and 17 18 Whereas, educating men, their families, and health care providers about the 19 importance of early detection of male health problems can result in reducing rates of 20 mortality for male-specific diseases, as well as improve the health of America's men and 21 America's overall economic well-being; and 22 Whereas, recent scientific studies have shown that regular medical exams, preventive screenings, regular exercise, and healthy eating habits can help save lives; 23 24 and 25 Whereas, establishing an Office of Men's Health is needed to investigate these scientific study findings and take such further actions as may be needed to 26 27 promote men's health; Now, therefore, 28 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6	(a) There	e is established in the Department the Office of Men's Health. The
7	purpose of the c	office is to expand the State's public health concerns and focus to include
8	a comprehensive outlook on the overall health status of men. The primary goals of the	
9	Office shall be the prevention of disease and improvement in the quality of life for men	
10	over their entire	e lifespan. The Department shall develop strategies for achieving these
11	goals which sha	<u>ll include, but not be limited to:</u>
12	<u>(1)</u>	Developing a strategic plan to improve public services and programs
13		targeting men;
14	<u>(2)</u>	Conducting policy analyses on specific issues related to men's health;
15	<u>(3)</u>	Facilitating communication among the Department's programs and
16		between the Department and external men's health groups and
17		community-based organizations;
18	<u>(4)</u>	Building public health awareness and capacity regarding men's health
19		issues by providing a series of services including evaluation,
20		recommendation, technical assistance, and training; and
21	<u>(5)</u>	Developing initiatives for modification or expansion of health services
22		oriented towards men's health issues with the intent of establishing
23		meaningful public/private partnerships in the future.
24		Office shall study the feasibility of establishing initiatives for:
25	<u>(1)</u>	Early intervention services for men infected with HIV; and
26	<u>(2)</u>	Outreach, treatment, and follow-up services to men at high risk for
27		contracting sexually transmitted diseases.
28	In conducting the study, the Department shall take into consideration related services	
29	already in place in the Department and at the local level."	
30	SECTION 2. The Department of Health and Human Services shall use funds	
31	available for the 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 fiscal years to implement this act.	
32	SEC.	FION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
