9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-217(g) reads as rewritten:
11	"(g) Any person who willfully violates subsection (a) of this section and strikes
12	any person causing serious bodily injury to that person person shall be guilty of a Class
13	I felony."
14	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-4.01(27)d4. reads as rewritten:
15	"d4. School bus. – A vehicle whose primary purpose is to transport
16	school students over an established route to and from school for
17	the regularly scheduled school day, that is equipped with
18	alternately flashing red lights on the front and rear and a
19	mechanical stop signal, and that bears the plainly visible words
20	"School Bus" on the front and rear in letters at least 8 inches in
21	height. rear. The term includes a public, private, or parochial
22	vehicle that meets this description."
23	SECTION 3. G.S. 20-4.01(27)d4., as rewritten by Section 2 of this act, reads
24	as rewritten:
25	"d4. School bus. – A vehicle whose primary purpose is to transport
26	school students over an established route to and from school for
27	the regularly scheduled school day, that is equipped with
27	the regularly scheduled school day, that is equipped wit

1	alternately flashing red lights on the front and rear and a
2	mechanical stop signal, that is painted primarily yellow below
3	the roofline, and that bears the plainly visible words "School
4	Bus" on the front and rear. The term includes a public, private,
5	or parochial vehicle that meets this description."
6	SECTION 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2007 and
7	applies to offenses committed on or after that date. Section 3 of this act becomes
8	effective August 1, 2007, and applies to all school buses acquired on or after that date.
9	The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
