BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 442 authorizes Caswell County to levy a 3% occupancy tax. At least two-thirds of the proceeds would be used to promote travel and tourism and the remainder would be used for tourism-related expenditures. This bill conforms to the guidelines supported by the North Carolina Travel and Tourism Coalition and adhered to by the House Finance Committee.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

Caswell County

The bill allows Caswell County to levy a 3% occupancy tax. According to the county manager for Caswell County, there is one motel in the county. The motel is located in Yanceyville and is expected to generate approximately \$3,000 each year for Caswell County based on the proposed occupancy tax rate of 3% each for the county and the town. Applying the General Consumer Price Index rate of increase for future years provides the following revenue estimate:
