BILL SUMMARY: Senate Bill 496 authorizes Perquimans County to levy a 6% occupancy tax. At least two-thirds of the proceeds would be used to promote travel and tourism and the remainder would be used for tourism-related expenditures. This bill conforms to the guidelines supported by the North Carolina Travel and Tourism Coalition and adhered to by the House Finance Committee.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: County officials were unavailable to provide estimates for this analysis. According to the economic census there is one motel in the county. Assuming that there are 35 rooms, an average occupancy of 60% and an average room rate of \$60 a night we determined the base estimate. The figure was then grown using consumer price index estimates from Moody's to give this revenue stream:
