5 6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new

11	The North Carolina Commission on Climate Change is hereby established.
12	" <u>§ 120-70.151. Membership; cochairs; meetings; vacancies; quorum.</u>
13	(a) The North Carolina Commission on Climate Change shall consist of 15 members as
14	follows:
15	(1) Five Senators appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
16	(2) Five Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of
17	<u>Representatives.</u>
18	(3) Five members from the executive branch to be appointed by the Governor.
19	(b) Members of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing officers.
20	(c) <u>The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate one Senator to serve as</u>
21	Cochair, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one Representative to
22	serve as Cochair.
23	(d) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a legislative member of the
24	Commission shall continue to serve for so long as the member remains a member of the
25	General Assembly and no successor has been appointed. A legislative member of the
26	Commission who does not seek reelection or is not reelected to the General Assembly may
27	complete a term of service on the Commission until the day on which a new General Assembly
28	convenes. A legislative member of the Commission who resigns or is removed from service in
29	the General Assembly shall be deemed to have resigned or been removed from service on the
30	Commission. Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing officer. Any
31	vacancy that occurs on the Commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original
32	appointment.
33	(e) <u>A quorum of the Commission shall consist of eight members.</u>
