8	accordance with the requirements of this section.

15	SECTION 2. Article 4A of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by		
16	adding the following new section to read:

19	A pharmacy operating in this State may elect to participate in the cancer drug and medical		
20	device repository program established under G.S. 130A-216."		
21	SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of		
22	Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of one hundred thousand		
23	dollars (\$100,000) for the 2009-2010 fiscal year for the implementation of this act.		
24	SECTION 4. Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2009. The remainder		
25	of this act is effective when it becomes law.
