A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO CREATE A LIMITED EXCEPTION TO THE POLICY OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA THAT REQUIRES THAT A TUITION SURCHARGE BE 3 4 IMPOSED ON ANY UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT WHO EXCEEDS THE LIMIT OF 5 ONE HUNDRED FORTY CREDIT HOURS.
- 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 SECTION 1. Subsection (b) of Section 89 of Chapter 321 of the 1993 Session 8 Laws, as amended by Section 17.10 of Chapter 769 of the 1993 Session Laws, reads as 9 rewritten:

10 "(b) The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall ensure that 11 procedures are established that are necessary to impose a twenty-five percent (25%) tuition 12 surcharge on students who take more than 140 degree credit hours to complete a baccalaureate 13 degree in a four-year program or more than one hundred ten percent (110%) of the credit hours 14 necessary to complete a baccalaureate degree in any program officially designated by the Board of Governors as a five-year program. The calculation of these credit hours taken at a constituent 15 institution or accepted for transfer shall exclude hours earned through the College Board's 16 17 Advanced Placement or CLEP examinations, through institutional advanced placement or 18 course validation, or through summer term or extension programs. No surcharge shall be 19 imposed on any student who exceeds the degree credit hour limits within the equivalent of four 20 academic years of regular term enrollment, or within five academic years of regular term enrollment in a degree program officially designated by the Board of Governors as a five-year 21 22 program. The Board of Governors may establish a policy that provides for an exemption to the 23 tuition surcharge for students who demonstrate military deployment, serious medical debilitation, or other extraordinary hardship that has substantially disrupted or interrupted the 24 25 pursuit of a degree. The Board shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight 26 Committee by April 1, 1994, on its recommendations for implementing this surcharge." 27

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.



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
