"§ 160A-439. Ordinance authorized as to repair, closing, and demolition of nonro	esidential
buildings or structures; order of public officer.	
(a) Authority. – The governing body of the city may adopt and enforce of relating to nonresidential buildings or structures that fail to meet minimum start maintenance, sanitation, and safety established by the governing body. The minimum shall address only conditions that are dangerous and injurious to public health, sat welfare and identify circumstances under which a public necessity exists for the repair or demolition of such buildings or structures. The ordinance shall provide for design appointment of a public officer to exercise the powers prescribed by the ordinaccordance with the procedures specified in this section. Such ordinance shall applicable within the corporate limits of the eity-city and any properties with at percent (50%) of the property's boundaries adjacent to the corporate limits of that circumstances is exercising jurisdiction over pursuant to G.S. 153A-372.1 as of May 1, 2010.
