2	AN ACT TO DIRECT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA INSTITUTE ON
3	AGING, AND THE DIVISION OF AGING AND ADULT SERVICES, DEPARTMENT
4	OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, TO TAKE A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN
5	HELPING NORTH CAROLINA PREPARE FOR INCREASED NUMBERS OF OLDER
6	ADULTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE NORTH CAROLINA STUDY
7	COMMISSION ON AGING.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. The University of North Carolina Institute on Aging, and the
10	Division of Aging and Adult Services, Department of Health and Human Services, shall help
11	the State prepare for increased numbers of older adults, due to the aging of the baby boomer
12	generation and the influx of elderly retirees into the State. Activities shall include, but are not
13	limited to, the following:
14	(1) Organizing and facilitating meetings of gerontologists, researchers, county
15	representatives, directors of area agencies on aging, and providers of State
16	services, to collectively identify and prioritize issues for the State to address.
17	(2) Working with the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, the
18	University of North Carolina School of Government, higher education
19	departments of municipal and regional planning and their partners, and area
20	agencies on aging to establish a Web site containing:
21	a. Information on fostering retiree and volunteer involvement, and
22	b. Models of local planning efforts, in order to assist municipalities in
23	addressing accessibility and service delivery for increasing numbers
24	of older adults.
25	SECTION 2. The University of North Carolina Institute on Aging, and the
26	Division of Aging and Adult Services, Department of Health and Human Services, shall make
27	progress reports on the activities required by this act to the Governor and to the North Carolina
28	Study Commission on Aging on or before March 1, 2010, and on or before November 1, 2010.
29	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
