6	Whereas, approximately 25% of the new jobs created in North Carolina over	the
7	next 10 years will require at least a four-year college degree, and an additional 13%	are

9	Whereas, only 19% of entering ninth graders in North Carolina complete his	igh
10	school and college within 150% of program time; and	
11	Whereas, slightly over 50% of recently graduated North Carolina high sche	ool
12	students require remediation in the form of one or more developmental classes before	ore
13	beginning college-level work at a North Carolina community college; and	
14	Whereas, having to take remediation greatly reduces the likelihood that students v	vill
15	complete college programs on time, as well as overall success rates; and	
16	Whereas, students requiring remediation could get a jump start and improve	
17	likelihood of program completion by taking those classes in the summer prior to enrolling	; in
18	college-level courses; and	
19	Whereas, since the 2001-2002 recession year, community colleges have not be	en
20	funded to provide summer school classes; Now, therefore,	
21	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
22	SECTION 1. G.S. 115D-5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
23	"(u) Community colleges may teach developmental courses and college success sk	
24	courses at any time during the year, including the summer term. Membership hours produce	
25	from these courses shall be counted when computing full-time equivalent students (FTE)	for
26	use in budget funding formulas at the State level."	
27	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2009.
