- (3) Require that the tow operator accept, in addition to other forms of payment, credit or debit cards in payment for towing services.
- (4) Require that the tow operator allow the owner or operator of the vehicle to have access to the vehicle to retrieve medicine, pets, and personal property.
- (5) Require that the lot to which the vehicle is removed be secure and properly lighted.
- Require the tow operator to notify the city police department within a reasonable time after initiating a tow, to maintain a telephone number that is answered 24 hours a day, and to respond to requests to release vehicles to those owners or operators within a reasonable time after receiving a request to do so.
- (7) Require that daily vehicle storage fees may not take effect until the vehicle has been stored at least 12 hours, and such fees may not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the fee established pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection.

Any ordinance adopted pursuant to this subsection shall be based on findings by the governing body that such ordinance is in the interest of public safety."

SECTION 2. This act applies to the City of Asheville only.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2009, and applies to vehicles towed on or after that date.
