9 **INTRODUCTION**

10 SECTION 1.1. The appropriations made in this act are for maximum amounts 11 necessary to provide the services and accomplish the purposes described in the budget in 12 accordance with the State Budget Act. Savings shall be affected where the total amounts appropriated are not required to perform these services and accomplish these purposes, and the 13 savings shall revert to the appropriate fund at the end of each fiscal year, except as otherwise 14 15 provided by law.
