A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS AN EMERGENCY JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OR THE DISTRICT COURT.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5

SECTION 1. G.S. 7A-52 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 7A-52. Retired district and superior court judges may become emergency judges 7 subject to recall to active service; compensation for emergency judges on recall.

8 Judges of the district court and judges of the superior court who have not reached (a) 9 the mandatory retirement age specified in G.S. 7A-4.20, but who have retired under the 10 provisions of G.S. 7A-51, or under the Uniform Judicial Retirement Act after having completed five years of creditable service, may apply as provided in G.S. 7A-53 to become emergency 11 12 judges of the court from which they retired. any court on which they served. The Chief Justice 13 of the Supreme Court may order any emergency judge of the district or superior court who, in 14 his opinion, is competent to perform the duties of a judge of the court from which such judge 15 retired, any court on which the judge served, to hold regular or special sessions of such court, as needed. Order of assignment shall be in writing and entered upon the minutes of the court to 16 which such emergency judge is assigned. 17

18 In addition to the compensation or retirement allowance the judge would otherwise (b) 19 be entitled to receive by law, each emergency judge of the district or superior court who is 20 assigned to temporary active service by the Chief Justice shall be paid by the State the judge's actual expenses, plus four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for each day of active service rendered 21 22 upon recall. No recalled retired trial judge shall receive from the State total annual 23 compensation for judicial services in excess of that received by an active judge of the bench to 24 which the judge is recalled."

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SECTION 2. G.S. 7A-53 reads as rewritten:

26 "§ 7A-53. Application to the Governor; commission as emergency judge.

27 No retired judge of the district or superior court may become an emergency judge except 28 upon his written application to the Governor certifying his desire and ability to serve as an 29 emergency judge. If the Governor is satisfied that the applicant qualifies under G.S. 7A-52(a) 30 to become an emergency judge and that he is physically and mentally able to perform the 31 official duties of an emergency judge, he shall issue to such applicant a commission as an 32 emergency judge of the court from which he retired. any court on which the judge served. The 33 commission shall be effective upon the date of its issue and shall terminate when the judge to whom it is issued reaches the maximum age for judicial service under G.S. 7A-4.20(a)." 34
