4	SECTION 2. G.S. 130A-185 reads as rewritten:		
5	"§ 130A-185. Vaccination of all dogs and cats.required.		
6	(a) <u>Vaccination required.</u> — The owner of every dog and cat an animal listed in this		
7	subsection over four months of age shall have the animal vaccinated against rabies. The time or		
8	times of vaccination shall be established by the Commission. Rabies vaccine shall be		
9	administered only by a licensed veterinarian or by a certified rabies vaccinator.rabies:		
10	<u>(1)</u> <u>Cat.</u>		
11	<u>(2)</u> <u>Dog.</u>

13	(b) <u>Vaccination.</u> – Only animal rabies vaccine licensed by the United States Department

20 21	SECTION 3. G.S. 130A-187 reads as rewritten:		
21	"§ 130A-187. County rabies vaccination clinics.		
22	(a) <u>Local Clinics.</u> The local health director shall organize or assist other county		
23 24	departments to organize at least one countywide rabies vaccination clinic per year for the purpose of vaccinating does and cats animals required to be vaccinated under this Part. Public		
25	purpose of vaccinating dogs and cats.animals required to be vaccinated under this Part. Public notice of the time and place of rabies vaccination clinics shall be published in a newspaper		
26	having general circulation within the area.		
27	(b) Fee. – The county board of commissioners may establish a fee to be charged for a		
28	rabies vaccination given at a county rabies vaccination clinic. The fee amount may consist of		
29	the following:		
30	(1) A charge for administering and storing the vaccine, not to exceed ten dollars		
31	(\$10.00).		
32	(2) The actual cost of the rabies vaccine, the vaccination certificate, and the		
33	rabies vaccination tag."		
34	SECTION 4. G.S. 130A-188 is repealed.		
35	SECTION 5. G.S. 130A-189 reads as rewritten:		
36	"§ 130A-189. Rabies vaccination certificates.		
37	A licensed veterinarian or a certified rabies vaccinator person who administers a rabies		
38	vaccine to a dog or cat shall complete a three copy rabies vaccination certificate. The		
39	Commission shall adopt rules specifying the information that must be included on the		
40	certificate. The An original rabies vaccination certificate shall be given to the owner of each dog		
41	or cat the animal that receives the rabies vaccine. One A copy of the rabies vaccination		
42	certificate shall be retained by the licensed veterinarian or the certified rabies vaccinator. The		
43 44	other <u>A</u> copy shall <u>also</u> be given to the county agency responsible for animal control, provided the information given to the county agency shall not be used for commercial numbers "

G.S. 130A-192 reads as rewritten: 4 "§ 130A-192. Dogs and cats Animals not wearing required rabies vaccination tags. 5 The Animal Control Officer shall canvass the county to determine if there are any animals 6 there are any dogs or cats not wearing the required rabies vaccination tag. If a dog or cat an 7 animal required to wear a tag is found not wearing the required tag, one, the Animal Control 8 Officer shall check to see if the owner's identification can be found on the animal. If the animal 9 is wearing an owner identification tag, or if the Animal Control Officer otherwise knows who 10 the owner is, the Animal Control Officer shall notify the owner in writing to have the animal 11 vaccinated against rabies and to produce the required rabies vaccination certificate to the Animal Control Officer within three days of the notification. If the animal is not wearing an 12 13 owner identification tag and the Animal Control Officer does not otherwise know who the 14 owner is, the Animal Control Officer may impound the animal. The duration of the impoundment of these animals shall be established by the county board of commissioners, but 15 the duration shall not be less than 72 hours. During the impoundment period, the Animal 16 17 Control Officer shall make a reasonable effort to locate the owner of the animal. If the animal is not reclaimed by its owner during the impoundment period, the animal shall be disposed of in 18 19 one of the following manners: returned to the owner; adopted as a pet by a new owner; sold to 20 institutions within this State registered by the United States Department of Agriculture pursuant to the Federal Animal Welfare Act, as amended; or put to death by a procedure approved by the 21 22 American Veterinary Medical Association, the Humane Society of the United States or of the 23 American Humane Association. The Animal Control Officer shall maintain a record of all 24 animals impounded under this section which shall include the date of impoundment, the length 25 of impoundment, the method of disposal of the animal and the name of the person or institution 26 to whom any animal has been released." 27 SECTION 8. G.S. 130A-193 reads as rewritten: 28 "§ 130A-193. Vaccination and confinement of dogs and catsanimals brought into this 29 State. 30 (a) Vaccination Required. - A dog or cat An animal brought into this State that is 31 required to be vaccinated under this Part shall immediately be securely confined and shall be 32 vaccinated against rabies within one week after entry. The animal shall remain confined for two 33 weeks after vaccination. 34 Exceptions. – The provisions of subsection (a) shall not apply to: (b) 35 A dog or catAn animal brought into this State for exhibition purposes if the (1)36 animal is confined and not permitted to run at large; or large. 37 A dog or catAn animal brought into this State accompanied by a certificate (2)38 issued by a licensed veterinarian showing that the dog or cat animal is 39 apparently free from and has not been exposed to rabies and that the dog or 40 cat has received rabies vaccine within the past year.animal is currently 41 vaccinated against rabies." 42 SECTION 9. G.S. 130A-194 reads as rewritten: 43 "§ 130A-194. Quarantine of districts infected with rabies. 44 An area may be declared under quarantine against rabies by the local health director when the disease exists to the extent that the lives of persons are endangered. When quarantine is 45 declared, each dog and catanimal in the area that is required to be vaccinated under this Part 46 47 shall be confined on the premises of the owner or in a veterinary hospital. However, dogs or 48 cats-hospital unless the animal is on a leash or under the control and in the sight of a 49 responsible adult may be permitted to leave the premises of the owner or the veterinary

- 50 hospital.adult."
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  - SECTION 10. G.S. 130A-195 reads as rewritten:

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"§ 130A-195. Destroying stray dogs and cats in guarantine districts. 1 2 When quarantine has been declared and dogs and cats stray animals continue to run 3 uncontrolled in the area, any peace officer or Animal Control Officer shall have the right, after 4 reasonable effort has been made to apprehend the animals, to destroy the uncontrolled dogs and 5 eatsstray animals and properly dispose of their bodies." 6 **SECTION 11.** G.S. 130A-196 reads as rewritten: 7 "§ 130A-196. Confinement Notice and confinement of all-biting dogs and cats; notice to 8 local health director; reports by physicians; certain dogs exempt.animals. 9 Notice. – When a person has been bitten by  $\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac$ (a) 10 vaccinated under this Part, the person or parent, guardian or person standing in loco parentis of the person, and the person owning the animal or in control or possession of the animal shall 11 notify the local health director immediately and give the name and address of the person bitten 12 13 and the owner of the animal. If the animal that bites a person is a stray or feral animal, the local 14 agency responsible for animal control shall make a reasonable attempt to locate the owner of the animal. If the owner cannot be identified within 72 hours of the event, the local health 15 director may authorize the animal be euthanized, and the head of the animal shall be 16 17 immediately sent to the State Laboratory of Public Health for rabies diagnosis. A physician who attends a person bitten by an animal known to be a potential carrier of 18 19 rabies shall report the incident within 24 hours to the local health director. The report must 20 include the name, age, and sex of the person. All dogs and cats 21 (b) Confinement. - When an animal required to be vaccinated under this Part that 22 bitebites a person person, the animal shall be immediately confined for 10 days in a place 23 designated by the local health director. However, the The local health director may authorize a 24 dog trained and used by a law enforcement agency to be released from confinement to perform 25 official duties upon submission of proof that the dog has been vaccinated for rabies in 26 compliance with this Part. After reviewing the circumstances of the particular case, the local 27 health director may allow the owner to confine the animal on the owner's property. An owner 28 who fails to confine his-an\_animal in accordance with the instructions of the local health 29 director shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor. If the owner or the person who controls or 30 possesses a dog or cat the animal that has bitten a person refuses to confine the animal as 31 required by this section, subsection, the local health director may order seizure of the animal 32 and its confinement for 10 days at the expense of the owner. A physician who attends a person 33 bitten by an animal known to be a potential carrier of rabies shall report within 24 hours to the 34 local health director the name, age and sex of that person." 35 SECTION 12. G.S. 130A-197 reads as rewritten: 36 "§ 130A-197. Infected dogs and cats animals to be destroyed; protection of vaccinated 37 dogs and cats.animals. 38 When the local health director reasonably suspects that a dog or catan animal required to be 39 vaccinated under this Part has been exposed to the saliva or nervous tissue of a proven rabid 40 animal or animal reasonably suspected of having rabies that is not available for laboratory 41 diagnosis, the dog or catanimal shall be considered to have been exposed to rabies. A dog or 42 catAn animal exposed to rabies shall be destroyed immediately by its owner, the county

Animal Control Officer or a peace officer unless the <u>dog or catanimal</u> has been vaccinated against rabies in accordance with this Part and the rules of the Commission more than <del>three</del> weeks-<u>28 days</u> prior to being exposed, and is given a booster dose of rabies vaccine within

46 three<u>five</u> days of the exposure. As an alternative to destruction, the <u>dog or cat animal</u> may be 47 quarantined at a facility approved by the local health director for a period up to six months, and 48 under reasonable conditions imposed by the local health director."

- 49 SECTION 13. G.S. 130A-198 reads as rewritten:
- 50 "**§ 130A-198. Confinement.**

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1	A person who owns or has possession of an animal which is suspected of having rabies
2	shall immediately notify the local health director or county Animal Control Officer and shall
3	securely confine the animal in a place designated by the local health director. Dogs and cats The
4	animal shall be confined for a period of 10 days. Other animals may be destroyed at the
5	discretion of the State Public Health Veterinarian."
6	<b>SECTION 14.</b> G.S. 130A-199 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 130A-199. Rabid animals to be destroyed; heads to be sent to State Laboratory of
8	Public Health.

Public Health.
An animal diagnosed as having rabies by a licensed veterinarian shall be destroyed and its
head sent to the State Laboratory of Public Health. The heads of all dogs and catsanimals that
die during the 10-day a confinement period required by G.S. 130A-196, this Part shall be
immediately sent to the State Laboratory of Public Health for rabies diagnosis."

13 **SECTION 15.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2009.
