	b. A person who is a sanitary engineer, public health engineer, public
	health engineering assistant, registered professional engineer,
	industrial hygienist, health physicist, chemist, epidemiologist,
	toxicologist, geologist, hydrogeologist, waste management specialist,
	or soil scientist, except when the person is working as a
	sanitarian.scientist.

	d. A person who holds a North Carolina license to practice medicine,
	veterinary medicine, or nursing.
