2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT BLADEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE MAY OPT OUT OF  
3 PARTICIPATION IN THE WILLIAM D. FORD FEDERAL DIRECT LOAN  
4 PROGRAM.  
5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  
6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 115D-40.1(e) reads as rewritten:  
7 "(e) Exception to Participation in Federal Loan Programs. – Notwithstanding subsection  
8 (d) of this section, the board of trustees of a college may adopt a resolution declining to  
9 participate in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program. The board of trustees of any  
10 college that has declined to participate in the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program  
11 through the adoption of a resolution may rescind the resolution and participate in the Program  
12 but shall not have the authority to again decline participation in the Program.  
13 This subsection applies only to Alamance Community College, Beaufort County  
14 Community College, Bladen Community College, Brunswick Community College, Caldwell  
15 Community College and Technical Institute, Central Carolina Community College, Central  
16 Piedmont Community College, Cleveland Community College, Gaston College, James Sprunt  
17 Community College, Lenoir Community College, Martin Community College, Mitchell  
18 Community College, Montgomery Community College, Pamlico Community College,  
19 Randolph Community College, Richmond Community College, Robeson Community College,  
20 Rockingham Community College, Rowan-Cabarrus Community College, Sandhills  
21 Community College, and Stanly Community College, Surry Community College, and Sampson  
22 Community College, South Piedmont Community College, and Vance-Granville Community  
23 College, Wilkes Community College."  
24 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
