21	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of				
22	Justice the sum of sixty-nine thousand nine hundred thirty-four dollars (\$69,934) for fiscal year				
23	2011-2012, and the sum of one hundred twenty-three thousand five hundred forty-three dollars				
24	(\$123,543) for fiscal year 2012-2013 to be allocated to the State Bureau of Investigation for				
25	testing and analysis of the DNA samples required by this act. There is appropriated from the				
26	General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of forty-four thousand seven hundred sixty				
27	dollars (\$44,760) for fiscal year 2012-2013 to be allocated to the Administrative Office of the				
28	Courts for the administration of the provisions of this act.				
29	SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective December 1, 2011, and				
30	applies to offenses committed on or after that date. The remainder of this act becomes effective				

30 applies to off31 July 1, 2011.
