a final judgment awarding monetary damages against an elected or appointed member of the

city council, either individually or jointly, may enforce that final judgment using any of the

remedies set forth in G.S. 105-366(b) or the procedure for attachment and garnishment set forth

in G.S. 105-368 as if final judgment awarding monetary damages were delinquent taxes and

judgments awarding monetary damages that are unsatisfied or entered on or after that date.
