12		nereas, in this alert, the NIOSH presents a standard precautions or	universal

20	all aspects of alerts from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health regardless of			
21	the setting in order to protect health care personnel in this State from hazardous exposure to

setting. Rule making under this section shall consider input from hospitals, organizations 1 2 representing health care personnel, and other stakeholders and shall consider reasonable time 3 for facilities to implement new requirements. The rules adopted must be consistent with and not 4 exceed provisions adopted by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health's 2004 5 alert on preventing occupational exposures to antineoplastic and other hazardous drugs in 6 health care settings as updated in 2010. The Department's adoption of the rules may incorporate 7 updates and changes to the Institute's guidelines as made by the Centers for Disease Control 8 and Prevention. The Commissioner of Labor shall investigate complaints and enforce these 9 requirements in accordance with the provisions of this Part." 10 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
