1 join the funeral procession for the purpose of securing the right-of-way granted by this 2 subsection.

3 (d) Operators of vehicles in a funeral procession shall drive on the right-hand side of the 4 roadway and shall follow the vehicle ahead as closely as reasonable and prudent having due 5 regard for speed and existing conditions.

6 (e) Operators of vehicles in a funeral procession shall yield the right of way<u>A</u> funeral 7 procession shall have the right-of-way at intersections regardless of traffic control signs or 8 signals, except that the operator of any vehicle in a funeral procession shall (i) yield the 9 right-of-way to law enforcement vehicles, fire protection vehicles, rescue vehicles, ambulances, 10 and other emergency vehicles giving appropriate warning signals by light or siren and shall(ii) 11 yield the right-of-way when directed to do so by a law enforcement officer.

(f) Operators of vehicles in a funeral procession shall proceed at the posted minimum
speed, except that the operator of such vehicle shall exercise reasonable care having due regard
for speed and existing conditions.

15 (g) The operator of a vehicle proceeding in the opposite direction as a funeral 16 procession may yield to the funeral procession. If the operator chooses to yield to the 17 procession, the operator must do so by reducing speed, or by stopping completely off the 18 roadway when meeting the procession or while the procession passes, so that operators of other 19 vehicles proceeding in the opposite direction of the procession can continue to travel without 20 leaving their lane of traffic.

(h) The operator of a vehicle proceeding in the same direction as a funeral procession shall not pass or attempt to pass the funeral procession, except that the operator of such a vehicle may pass a funeral procession when the highway has been marked for two or more lanes of moving traffic in the same direction of the funeral procession.

25 An operator of a vehicle shall not knowingly drive between vehicles in a funeral (i) 26 procession by crossing their path unless directed to do so by a person authorized to direct 27 traffic. When a funeral procession is proceeding through a steady or strobe-beam stoplight 28 emitting a red light as permitted by subsection (c), subsections (c) and (e) of this section, an 29 operator of a vehicle that is not in the funeral procession shall not enter the intersection 30 knowing a funeral procession is in progress, even if facing a steady or strobe-beam stoplight 31 emitting a green light, unless the operator can do so safely without crossing the path of the 32 funeral procession.

(j) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent State or local law enforcement
officers from escorting funeral processions in law enforcement vehicles.

35 A funeral establishment may only use a lead vehicle in a funeral procession that is (i1) 36 not a State or local law enforcement vehicle upon registering with the Division and paying a fee to the Division of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). The registration required under this 37 38 subsection shall include a description of each vehicle that will be used by the funeral 39 establishment as a lead vehicle in a funeral procession and any additional information requested 40 by the Division. The registration required under this subsection shall be in a form prescribed and furnished by the Division and may be submitted to the Division electronically. The 41 42 registration required under this subsection does not expire, but a funeral establishment shall 43 amend its registration prior to using a vehicle not described in its initial registration. The Division shall not charge an additional fee for an amendment provided in accordance with this 44 45 subsection. A violation of this subsection is an infraction punishable by a fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). Violation of this subsection shall not constitute negligence per se. Fees 46 47 collected under this subsection shall be credited to the Highway Fund.

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(k) A violation of this section shall not constitute negligence per se.

49 (*l*) To the extent that a local government unit's ordinance is in direct conflict with any
50 part of this statute, the ordinance shall control and prevail over the conflicting part.

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1	(m) A violation of this section shall not be considered a moving violation for purposes		
2	of G.S. 58-36-65 or G.S. 58-36-75.		
3	(n) <u>A funeral director, funeral establishment, or any of their employees or agents shall</u>		
4	not be liable for any death, personal injury, or property damage resulting from, caused by, or		
5	arising from any action or inaction of an operator of a vehicle in a funeral procession if (i) the		
6	funeral procession was operating in accordance with the provisions of this section or (ii) the		
7	funeral procession would have been operating in accordance with the provisions of this section		
3	but for a negligent act or omission in the operation of one or more vehicles in the funeral		
9	procession, provided that this limited grant of immunity shall not apply if the death, personal		
0	injury, or property damage arose from a negligent act or omission in the operation of a vehicle		
1	operated by the funeral director, funeral establishment, or any of their employees or agents. The		
2	operator of a vehicle in a funeral procession shall not be deemed to be an agent of the funeral		
3	director or funeral establishment unless such operator is either of the following:		
4	(1) <u>An employee of the funeral director or funeral establishment and acting in</u>		
5	the course of his or her employment.		
5	(2) <u>An independent contractor retained by the funeral director or funeral</u>		
7	establishment and performing services for the funeral director, funeral		
3	establishment, or funeral home."		
9	SECTION 2. G.S. 20-157.1(n), as enacted by Section 1 of this act, becomes		
0	effective December 1, 2017, and applies to death, personal injury, or property damage		
21	occurring on or after that date. G.S. 20-157.1(c), (e), and (i), as amended by Section 1 of this		
22	act, become effective December 1, 2017, and apply to offenses committed on or after that date.		
23	G.S. 20-157.1(j1), as enacted by Section 1 of this act, becomes effective December 1, 2017,		
4 5	and applies to funeral processions held on or after that date. The remainder of this act becomes effective December 1, 2017.
