4	EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH				
5	INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES THROUGH THE NORTH				
6	CAROLINA LONGITUDINAL DATA SYSTEM, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE				
7	LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION COMMITTEE ON INTELLECTUAL AND				
8	DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.				
9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
10	SECTION 1. The Government Data Analytics Center (GDAC) shall establish a task				
11	force to study the collection and use of data among State agencies and stakeholders to evaluate				
12	education and employment programs and services for individuals with intellectual and				
13	developmental disabilities as part of the North Carolina Longitudinal Data System (System),				
14	established pursuant to Chapter 116E of the General Statutes. The task force shall include				
15	representatives from at least the following State agencies and stakeholders:				
16	(1) The Department of Health and Human Services.				
17	(2) The Department of Public Instruction.				
18	(3) The North Carolina Community College System.				
19	(4) The University of North Carolina.				
20	(5) Local school administrative units and charter schools.				
21	(6) Private colleges or universities.				
22	(7) The Department of Commerce.				
23	(8) The Department of Labor.				
24	(9) The Department of Revenue.				
25	(10) The North Carolina Postsecondary Education Alliance.				
26	(11) Community organizations serving individuals with intellectual and				
27	developmental disabilities.				
28	SECTION 2. The task force shall study issues related to collecting and sharing				
29	individual-level data among agencies through the System, including the Common Follow-Up				
30	System and NC SchoolWorks (P-20W), for the purpose of evaluating and reporting whether				
31	federal and State-supported education and employment programs and services for individuals				
32	with intellectual and developmental disabilities are effective in providing education and				
33	employment opportunities resulting in positive outcomes for those individuals. In doing so, the				

34 task force shall consider at least the following:

35 (1) Establishing uniform definitions of disability and requiring specificity by type
36 of disability to be used in the collection of data among agencies.



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1	(2)	Conducting an inventory of the unique individual identifiers used within each	
2		agency and determining whether any identifiers need to be added to facilitate	
3		the sharing of data.	
4	(3)	Identifying common performance measures and establishing key indicators,	
5		such as enrollment in postsecondary education or training, attainment of a	
6		postsecondary degree or credential, employment status and earnings, and	
7		poverty and receipt of public assistance.	
8	(4)	Establishing a uniform length of time in which individuals are tracked that is	
9		sufficient to evaluate long-term outcomes.	
10	(5)	Developing interagency data sharing agreements to facilitate the evaluation of	
11		data and reporting of outcomes.	
12	(6)	Identifying any limitations to sharing data through the System for the purpose	
13		of evaluating programs and services, including ensuring compliance with	
14		State and federal privacy laws, such as the Family Educational Rights and	
15		Privacy Act, the Internal Revenue Code, and the Health Insurance Portability	
16		and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The task force shall propose best	
17		practices for maximizing data sharing and the evaluation and reporting of data	
18		using the System within the parameters of State and federal privacy laws.	
19	(7)	Developing strategies to facilitate data sharing, evaluation, and reporting of	
20		outcomes of programs and services when the System cannot be utilized under	
21		certain circumstances, such as with small population sample sizes.	
22	SECT	FION 3. By October 1, 2018, GDAC shall report to the Joint Legislative	
23	Education Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and		
24	Human Services on the results of the study required by this act and any legislative		
25	recommendations from the task force.		
26	SECT	FION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
